## Sh.30 million medical supplies dispatched to health facilities



Bomet has dispatched Sh. 30 million worth of medical supplies to its 145 health facilities across the county. Governor Prof. Hillary Barchok, while receiving the supplies from Kenya Medical Supplies Authority (KEMSA) on Thursday said, his administration is working round the clock to ensure adequate supply of commodities as well as efficient and effective service delivery across the health facilities.

"Our people can now access quality health services across the County since our health facilities are now been equipped with additional medical supplies" Prof. Barchok said.

The Governor said that the delays in disbursement of funds from the National Treasury was affecting the

operations at the counties.

The Countywide distribution will be monitored and managed using the Health Department's Logistics Management Information System (LMIS) to enhance drugs storage and distribution.

## The Court Annexed Mediation programme to ease case backlogs

The rollout of the weeklong Mediation and Settlement exercise in Bomet has just concluded with parties concerned in congruent to adopt the Court Annexed Mediation programme as an alternative dispute resolution mechanism.

Speaking during the official launch, Governor Prof. Hillary Barchok, represented by the Deputy Governor H.E Hon. Shadrack Rotich, welcomed the move to introduce such programme in attempts to hasten delivery of justice noting that justice delayed is justice denied.

"The Judiciary plays an important role in administration of

Justice and as the County Government of Bomet, we will offer necessary support where necessary especially through the framework of court users committee (CUC)." Prof Barchok said. He added that the alternative conflict resolution mechanism will go a long way in delivering justice in a timely and efficient manner. It will also help in restoring broken relationships amicably among affected parties.

He lauded the Judiciary for establishing the programme saying it allowed the screening of cases brought to court for litigation to be referred for for possible settlement. Presiding Judge, Bomet Law Courts, Lady Justice Roselyne Korir pointed that the Court Annexed Mediation programme will significantly reduce backlog of cases thus saving time and money.

Also in attendance were Kericho Presiding Judge, Lady Justice Asenath Ongeri, Representatives from the Law Society of Kenya, Office of the Director of Public Prosecution, County Attorney and mediators across the country.
