Thirty-three AI services technicians graduate



Thirty-three Artificial Insemination technician have graduated from a refresher course training on Artificial Insemination conducted by the Kenya Agricultural Genetic Resource Center in collaboration with Bomet. Presiding over the graduation ceremony, Chief Administrative Secretary Jebii Kilimo challenged the

new trainees to use the knowledge they have gained to enhance conception rates and reduce wastage through repeat inseminations that subsequently discourage farmers from uptake of such useful technologies.

CAS Kilimo: Join cooperatives

Livestock and Fisheries Chief Administrative Secretary Jebii Kilimo has urged dairy farmers in the county to join the cooperative movement to bargain for better pricing and to reap better benefits from their produce. Kilimo said this at Balek Central Dairy Co-operative Society in Singorwet ward on a meet the dairy farmers tour during her two-day visit to the county.

Governor Dr Hillary Barchok together with the CAS Kilimo also visited the Liquid Nitrogen plant managed by Kenya Agricultural Genetic Resource Center in Sotik. KAGRC will soon establish an embryo transfer facility to increase the number of high-quality heifers for farmers as well as training veterinarians and veterinarian paraprofessionals to carry out embryo transfer.

Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency coordinator Eyup Yavuz Umutlu, Agriculture CEC Dr Kipchumba Toweett, Chief Officers Job Toweett (Agriculture), Dr Richard Sigei (Cooperatives) and Agricultural advisor Julius Twei were also present during the visit.

Sh. 1.4 billion Bomet-Longisa-Mulot water project enters evaluation stage



Governor Dr Hillary Barchok, Tuesday hosted Water, Sanitation and Irrigation Chief Administrative Secretary Dr Andrew Tuimur during a one-day inspection and commissioning of the ministry projects in the county.

The CAS inspected the progress of ongoing water projects worth more than Kshs 42M and also to commissioned Kabusare and Koita water projects which are complete.

“The tender for ADB funded Kshs 1.4B Bomet-Longisa-Mulot water project is at evaluation stage and will be awarded soon, marking the commencement of the project which will increase water access in our county by 20%.” Dr Barchok alluded.

Dr Barchok lauded the cordial working relations between the National government and the County government of Bomet.

The Ministry of Water and the County Government of Bomet have collaborated to construct 121 water pans worth kshs 20M in Chepalungu with a view to increasing acreage under Irrigation.

In attendance were DG Hon Shadrack Rotich, County Commissioner Susan Waweru, CEC Water Eng Peter Tonui, Lake Victoria South Water Works Chairman Mr Dan Omino among officers from the county and national government.

33 AI technicians graduate as Bomet Receive 20 AI kits from National Government

The training was undertaken to equip AI service providers with the latest strategies to improve on conception rates in the field and improve the genetic potential of our livestock.

The CAS said the Government through the Big 4 Agenda has prioritized livestock among other agricultural activities to ensure attainment of 100% food and nutrition security.

Governor Dr Hillary Barchok said “we will incorporate the use of ICT and innovation to improve livestock production as well as conducting periodical evaluation to assess the uptake and performance of the AI services in the County.

During the event, Bomet also received 20 AI Kits and 500 straws of semen from the State Department of Livestock and Fisheries in a bid to enhance livestock improvement and boost dairy production.

The kits will be distributed to cooperative societies and private A.I service providers to enable farmers assess AI services.

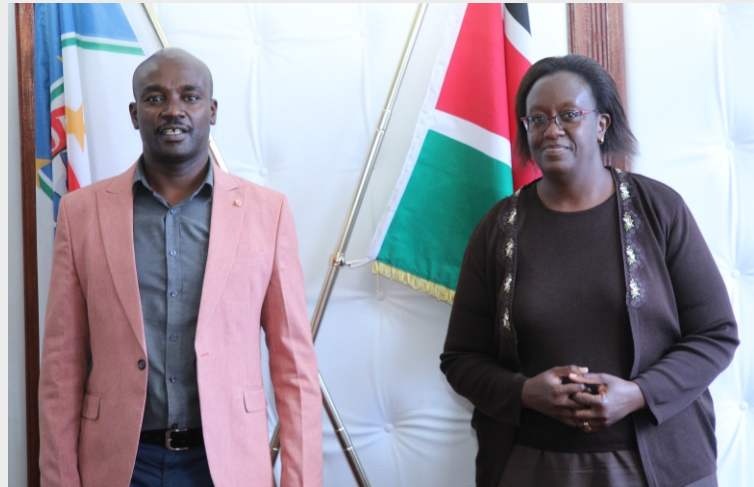
