Merigi: Barchok reiterates Government's commitment towards service delivery

Additionally, over 50 women groups representatives received training on digital marketing skills, the benefits of Affirmative funds and cooperative societies among others. Dairy farmers acquire equipment to boost dairy production

11 dairy value chain micro-groups have benefited from several farm implements geared towards enhancing dairy production in the county. The initiative rolled out by the Department of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries through the Kenya Climate Smart Programme (KCSAP) distributed chaff cutters, manual balers and mowing machines among other equipment. Agriculture CECM Dr Kipchumba Towett while acknowledging KCSAP support said that the department was upscaling the dairy value chain in the County. Also, the County Government of Bomet has unveiled a Food and Nutrition Strategic Plan which is aimed at improving food and nutrition security. Noteworthy, Bomet county produces approximately 300,000 liters of milk daily. So far, Sh 23 million has been rolled out in Mogogosiek ward to improve production of dairy, poultry, potatoes and Bananas through support to the micro project program.

A stitch in time: Residents applaud Disaster Management team's agile prowess



Bomet County Disaster Management Team, Friday afternoon responded to a distress call by a hay store owner in Silibwet in record time thanks to the just serviced-fire truck engine. Recently, Bomet Governor Dr Hillary Barchok unveiled several protective equipment for use by the Disaster Management Unit during incidences of fires, downing, bees attack and rescue. To enhance emergency responses, the Unit is introducing paramedic services as well as

acquiring an ambulance. The Unit is regionally renowned for its swiftness with an efficacy of 98% response to fire and drowning incidents.

“We are working towards regularizing their employment so that they can be permanent and pensionable” Dr Barchok said. He added that the County Government will seek to improve their training so that they can qualify to be taken on board under the Public Service Board as required in law.



The Unit's divers recently completed specialized military training from the Kenya Navy, and are the most sought after in counties in the Rift Valley and Nyanza. They have successfully searched and helped retrieve bodies in Nyamira, Kericho, Kisii, Siaya, Narok, Nakuru and Uasin Gishu Counties. The team was called upon to take part in the search-and-rescue mission after a helicopter crashed in Lake Nakuru in 2017, alongside the Navy team that was in charge of the recovery efforts.
