Bomet health facilities receive Cancer treatment machines

Governor Dr. Hillary Barchok, Monday, distributed 36 thermal-ablation machines to be used for cancer treatment at sub-county health and selected health centres across the county.

The machines were acquired jointly between the county government of Bomet, Ministry of Health and Clinton Health Access Initiative. "Cervical cancer is the second killer type of cancer in the county after Esophageal cancer found rampant. thus the need to devolve treatment to be accessed at the

nearest health facility by our residents," Dr. Barchok said. The County, with the support from National Cancer Institute, has trained 284 health care workers on the use of thermalablation machines to carry out screening and treatment of the disease.

Dr. Barchok called upon women to visit the nearest facilities for screening and early treatment of cervical cancer as the disease has been

"Out of the 200 screened women over the last few

months 20 were found positive of cervical cancer and we urge all women to avail themselves for early screening and treatment." Barchok pointed out.

Adding, "Our main focus in the health sector is to equip our health facilities with the necessary equipment to improve our health care systems."

The county is seeking to partner with various institutions on research and treatment of various types of cancer reported in the county.
