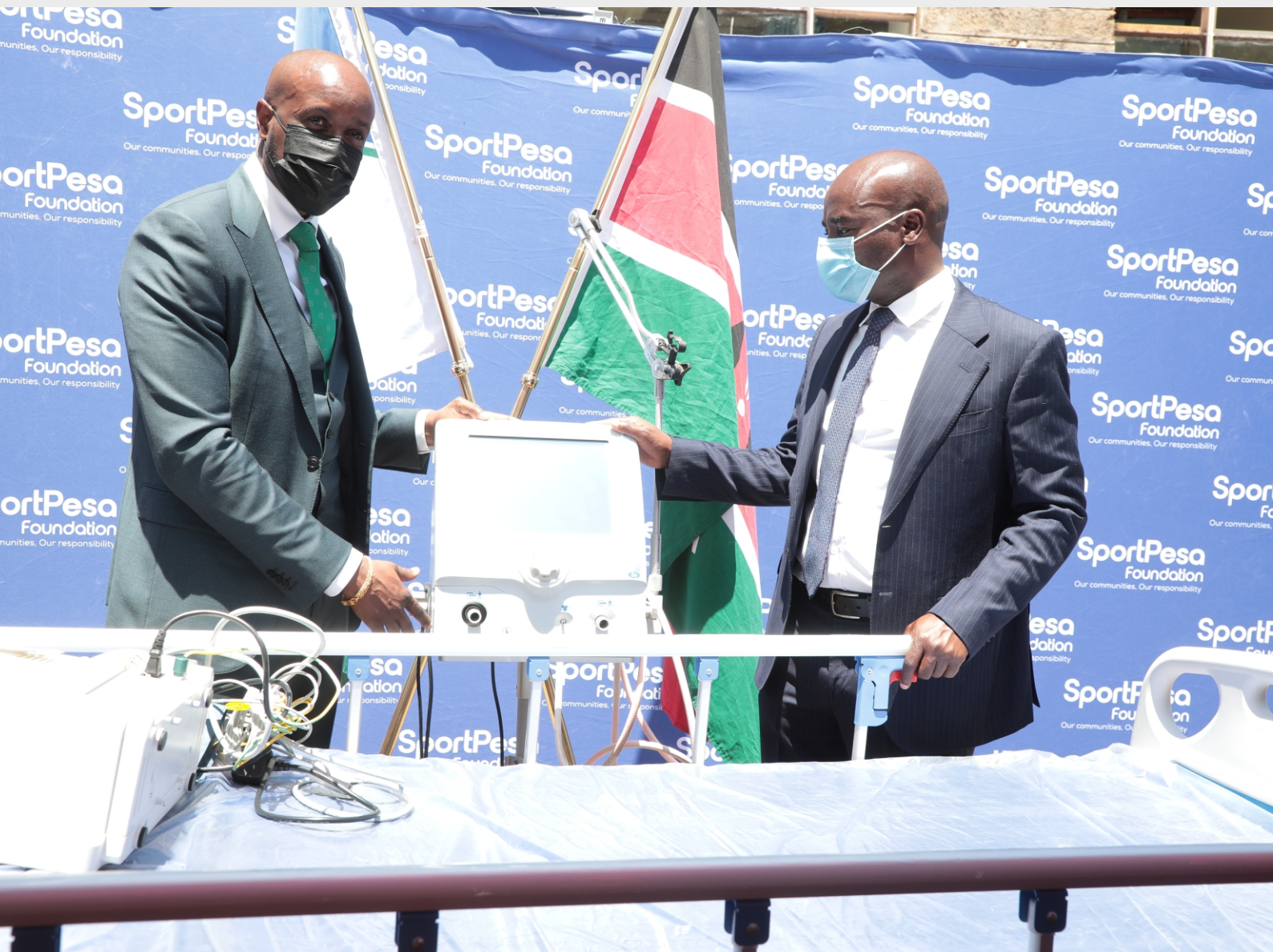

## Boost for Health Support as Bomet Receives ICU Beds

Bomet Governor Dr Hillary Barchok, Thursday received 5 ICU beds from Sportpesa Foundation led by CEO Ronald Karauri boosting health care access in the County.

Speaking during the reception, Dr Barchok thanked Mr Karauri and the Foundation for the donation saying that the gesture comes at an opportune time when the Kenyan Hospitals are grappling with inadequate ICU beds in the wake

of the deadly Covid19 delta variant that is taking a toll.

“These ICU beds will go along way in improving our health care system as it will complement our 4 Bed HDU center which also actualize our bid to have 10 ICU beds. Am happy that today, we have witnessed this feat.”
