Barchok joins colleague Governors to deliberate on matters devolution

Governor Dr Hillary Barchok, Monday, joined his colleagues for a full council meeting to deliberate on several issues among them; Division of Revenue, devolution conference, amendment of critical bills affecting devolution and partnership opportunities.

Since the inception of devolution, the 47 devolved units have made notable progress in Health, Agriculture, Infrastructure, Early Childhood Development among others. The Governors called on the national government to consider an additional funding of Kshs 381B bringing the total

allocation to the counties to Kshs 751B. The Constitution of Kenya Ammendment Bill, 2020 recommends that counties be allocated not less than 35% of all the revenue collected by the National Government.

650 cattle plunge dip as Barchok commissions Chepitet-Kapsio Dip in Mutarakwa ward



Chepitet-Kapsio Dip in Mutarakwa Ward, Bomet Central has joined the list of cattle dips that are complete and operational in Bomet.

Commissioning the dip, Governor Dr Hillary Barchok said that his administration has embarked on a strategic mission to revive all the cattle dips while constructing new ones in a bid to improve the milk production in our county.

"Farmers should take advantage of the cattle dips to practice dairy farming since it has huge returns and dairy products have readily available market. Chebunyo Milk processing plant will come in handy in improving the economic fortunes of farmers in Bomet." Dr Barchok said

During the event, a total of 650 cattle enjoyed the "bathe". Through the department of Agriculture, livestock and Fisheries, Chepitet Dip received a supply of 35 litres of Acaricide to kick-start the process. Bomet county produces an average 40,000 litres of milk daily.

Barchok visits Ndaraweta Ward on a development inspection tour

During the visit, Dr Barchok commissioned Kenon ECDE. "Early Childhood Education is an important time in child development when children learn critical social and emotional skills and a partnership is formed between the child, their parents and the teacher. This lays the groundwork for it to continue throughout the child's education."

He added that his administration will continue disbursing funds for the construction and completion of more ECD centres.

Thereafter, the Governor also inspected Nyongores Maternity wing which is expected to turn home deliveries into safe skilled deliveries and improve maternal health services in Ndaraweta.

Cheruiyot, Nyorgei homes now connected to the National grid

Governor Dr Hillary Barchok commissioned electricity connection at Chongenwo, Mogogosiek Ward, Friday. The County Government of Bomet and Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation have connected several families among them Christopher Cheruiyot, Peter Nyorgei, two churches and 46 other families from Chongenwo, Mogogosiek Ward in Konoin Subcounty to the national grid

The Governor said that the partnership with REREC will address the electricity gaps in areas not yet covered by the last mile program.

"We are using every available opportunity and resources at our disposal to address the needs of our residents" Dr Barchok said.
