WHY THE PLAN?

The Bomet County Annual Development Plan (CADP) for FY 2027/2028 is a roadmap that shows the programmes and projects the County Government plans to implement during the financial year.

It identifies the County's development priorities, expected results and the resources required to deliver services to the people of Bomet.

The CADP builds on the development priorities and programmes established under the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) 2023–2027, while providing continuity as the County moves into the next planning cycle.

Most importantly, the CADP is prepared through public participation. Residents and stakeholders have an opportunity to identify their priority needs, propose projects, give views on proposed programmes and provide feedback on County development priorities.

Your participation helps ensure that public resources are directed towards the needs and priorities of the people of Bomet.

WHAT DOES THE LAW SAY?

The preparation and public participation of the CADP is supported by the Constitution and national laws:

1. Constitution of Kenya – Article 201

Article 201 requires that public finance be managed according to principles of openness and accountability, including public participation in financial matters, equity, prudent use of public money and responsible financial management.

2. Public Finance Management Act, 2012 – Section 126(1)

Section 126(1) requires every county government to prepare a development plan containing its strategic priorities, programmes, expected services and outputs, performance indicators, budgets and significant capital developments, among other matters.

3. County Governments Act, 2012 – Section 115(1)

Section 115(1) provides that public participation in county planning processes is mandatory and requires the County Government to provide clear and understandable information to the public on matters being considered in the planning process.

These provisions provide the legal foundation for the County Government to involve residents in the preparation of the CADP.

BOMET COUNTY AT A GLANCE

Bomet County is located in Kenya's South Rift region and covers approximately 2,507 km². It has five Sub-Counties and 25 wards.

The County's economy is predominantly agricultural, with crop and livestock production providing livelihoods to a large proportion of the population. The County also has a youthful population, creating opportunities for investment in agriculture, education, skills development, health, enterprise development, employment and other services.

These characteristics guide the County's development priorities and investments.

THE BIGGER PICTURE

The CADP contributes to wider development goals and priorities, including:

- **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** – addressing poverty, food security, health, education, employment and sustainable development;
- **Kenya Vision 2030** – supporting Kenya's long-term development agenda;
- **Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA)** – particularly agriculture, MSMEs, employment and digital transformation; and
- **Africa Agenda 2063** – promoting inclusive and sustainable development.

The Plan also takes into account relevant sector plans, policies and the development priorities of Bomet County.
